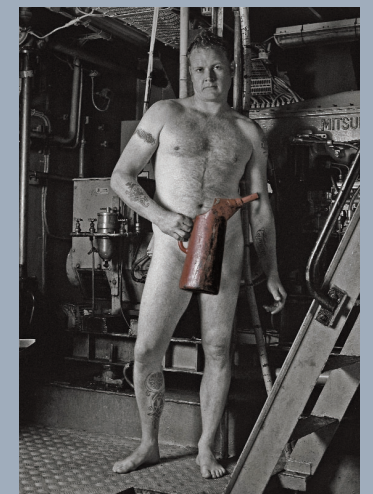
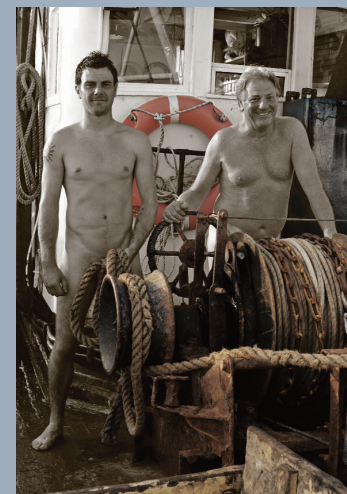
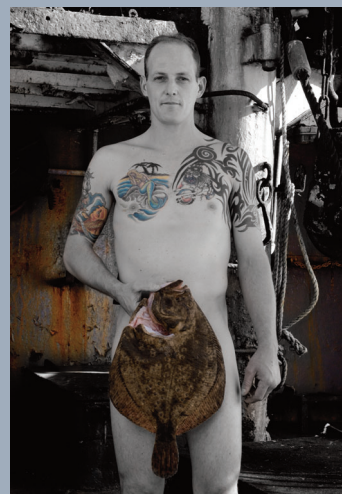
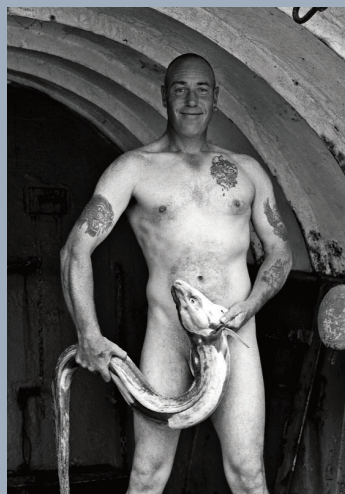
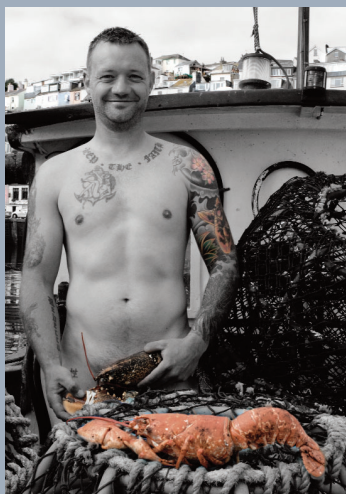
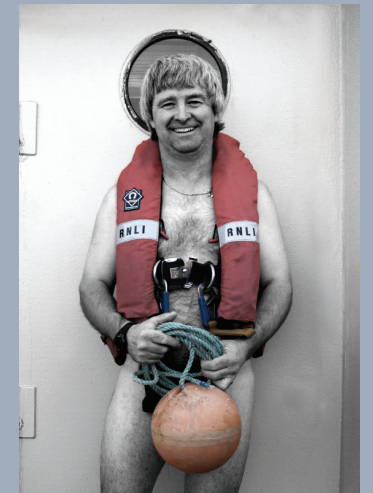
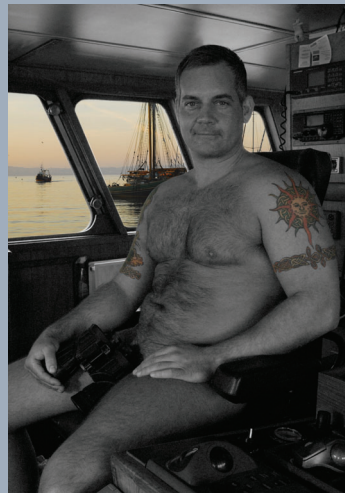
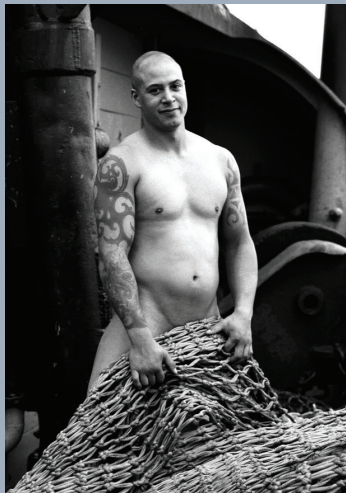
BRIXHAM FISHERMEN THE NAKED TRUTH

FISH was set up in 2007 to raise money for a statue to celebrate the fishing heritage of Brixham, Devon. It is known as the mother port of trawling and has links with many fishing ports around the world. From the time that the famous red sails began to appear until the present day fishermen have pitted themselves against the sea to bring home the silver harvest. Tales of heroism and loss are many, from wrecks to miraculous rescues in great storms. Fishing continues to be at the heart of this trusty harbour town by purchasing this calendar you help erect a statue in honour of these men, those who were lost or buried at sea, their families, their heritage and their home port, Brixham. The three meter bronze statue will be based on an etching by Arthur Briscoe, who drew fishermen at sea in the early 1900's, and will be sculpted by Elisabeth Hadley of Brixham.
